ADRA-Bosnia's director, Božidar Mihaljolić shared a project with us at Women's Ministries. The ADRA country office prepared a project to help socialization and economical strengthening of the unemployed and disabled women. More than 10 women went through the sewing course and the best three individuals (Vesna, Maya and Ivona) were employed in ADRA's sewing workshop.

For more than a year they have been making handbags and shopping bags from used clothes. But they are in need of a market to sell their products and make this project self-supporting. They managed to provide 20% of their

salaries from selling bags in the Adventist second hand shops and the rest they try to provide from other resources. We would like to make an appeal for this worthwhile project.

Could everyone reading this consider how to help this project go forward. Could you, for example, buy bags from them when you are holding meetings, could you sell bags at retreats and conferences. Do you know of shops that would be willing to take some of the bags on board?

### International women's day of prayer

Sweden's biggest church, Stockholm, is a forerunner when it comes to adapting the international women's day of prayer material. With the talented and enthusiastic Lydia Kulaba as leader they make sure that the women have the support they need of pastor Berny Carlsson and the church board.

Lydia's special mission is to make new people feel at home in their church. Thus she uses women's ministries as a platform for integration. A quick glimpse at the pictures show the variety of nationalities and age groups represented by the women involved at the International women's day of prayer programme.

I'm very grateful for the good work Lydia is doing in Stockholm and pray for rich blessings upon her and her team.



This year we even had Ekebyholm church participating in the international women's day of prayer. Pastor Liane Edlund took the day literally – so after the worship service she invited the women of the church home to a community of prayer in the afternoon. All who participated felt a special blessing. I was invited to a church plant and used the afternoon to inform about women's ministries and as a result we have a new contact person who is interested in doing women's ministries there.

In 2018 we have a special topic within the Swedish Union of Churches. It's called "With Jesus in your heart". Every first Sabbath each month the churches who want to participate get an outline for a sermon, a children's story and a children's activity book.

Having good pastor colleagues preparing this material, they made sure that for the first Sabbath in March there was a woman at the centre of the action. So even though there are not many churches officially participating in the International women's day of prayer, all Swedish churches had a sermon about the woman at the well this day.

## Women in the Bible and me

Some months ago the Gothenburg church started a "Women in the Bible and me" bible study group. They meet once a month on Sabbath afternoon.

For leader Tina Laketa this has been a big success. The work she puts into preparing each session (so far we haven't translated the material into Swedish, so she has to do this in addition to preparing the Bible study!) is blessed by about 20 happy participants of which there are 2-4 visitors.

I hope that soon there will be an official translation of the material so that more churches can follow Gothenburg's good example.
