- **3.** "For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law; indeed, it cannot. Those who are in the flesh cannot please God." (Romans 8:7). What connection does this and the previous text have with the life, death, and resurrection of Christ? (Galatians 2:19-20).
- **4.** Read Romans 12:1-3 together line by line. How do you understand:

"by the mercies of God"?

"present your bodies as living sacrifices"?

"spiritual worship"?

"Do not be conformed to this world"?

"be transformed"?

"testing & discern"?

"the will of God"?
