


The number 1 aim of TED Stewardship Ministries is to: Revive and awaken the biblical principles of Christian Stewardship, grace centred and gratitude focused.

f When Stewardship Sabbath is held, in the local church, is up to the local church to decide. The best time is when it will be most effective.

What if Stewardship Sabbath synced when local church officer elections are complete? Imagine for a moment, that we are able to break the all too familiar dysfunction of the local church nominating committee. We struggle to get members to serve. Brother Jones feels angst because he's not re-elected as Elder. Sister Smith grudgingly accepts a role for which she has little interest or gift. For the pastor (who usually serves as chair), it's the worst time of year! What if the appeal for commitment of time, talents and tithe were made all at the same time following this suggested process:

- Three months before the Nominating Committee meets, the pastor leads the congregation to discover their spiritual gifts.
- When the Nominating Committee meets, it is informed of the each member's Identified gifts, along with their willingness to serve.
- 3. The Nominating Committee then intelligently selects, in combination with the Spirit's leading, leaders to build up the church.
- Once the report is voted by the church, a Stewardship Sabbath serves to gain triple commitment of Tithe, Time and Talents. Commitment Sabbath could involve preparing a response card, inviting members to covenant in all three areas.




What are your Gifts?


