Why is visitation important?



- A neglected activity by the church
- It's an opportunity to get to know members
- It creates sympathy and connects hearts
- It promotes members spiritual growth and commitment to the church
- It shows that the leadership cares about its members
- It helps prevent apostasy, addresses heresies

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Principles of Visitation



- Mingling before and after church
- Telephone calls
- Neutral meeting places
- Home visitation



Principles of Visitation



- Home visitation
 - Prepare – pray, select a scripture
 - Befriend – show interest in family, active listening
 - Read – preselected scripture + short comment
 - Ask – prayer requests, concerns etc.
 - Pray – include requests, bless the home
 - Leave – leave promptly
 - Write – record the family's concerns and your impressions
