1. Understand the Biblical Purpose of the Church



- a. Develop mission and values consistent with that purpose
- b. Align ministries and resources consistent with that call
- c. Don't be afraid to let some things go
- d. Make sure the desire for growth is for the right reason
- e. Never stop casting vision.



2. Be Passionate and Committed to Evangelism



- a. Develop a culture of evangelism by being passionate about lost people.
- b. It is passion that will drive your people to sacrifice
- c. Create a culture of evangelism among yourself, your leaders and your church.
- d. It is a proven and effective way to grow an Adventist church



3. Cultivate a Faith-based Optimism



- a. Create a sense of expectation that God will work
- b. Set challenging but realistic goals which will build faith
- c. Go out of your way to acknowledge God at work
- d. Recognize short term gains



- 4. Make Disciples Instead of Just Making Members
  - a. People want to be challenged spiritually
  - b. If people stop growing, they will leave the church
  - c. Involve people in ministry and sharing their faith
  - d. Stress the spiritual disciplines



- 5. Commit to Improving the Health of the Church
  - a. Honest assessment and evaluation
  - b. Deal decisively with troublemakers
  - c. Secret visitors
  - d. Visit visitors and missing members
  - e. Natural Church Development, iCOR





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- 6. Celebrate Adventism
  - a. Adventist churches grow differently than other churches
  - b. Don't be afraid to be different
  - c. People are looking for something different





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- 7. Offer Meaningful Worship Experiences
  - a. Plan great worship experiences
  - b. Provide safe services
  - c. Provide biblical sermons
  - d. Provide variety and ways to involve worshippers
  - e. Strive for excellence





- 8. Strive to Connect With Visitors
  - a. Make first impressions count
  - b. Make sure the right people are in front
  - c. Go beyond greeting to connecting (guest services)
  - d. Create lingering opportunities
  - e. Wow factor
