I am sure that our first hike was not a coincidence. God gave us a possibility to turn to each other with a helping heart and support each other. ENDitNOW

On the 2nd of November 2016 four person (Zsóka Bodnár, Edit Bihariné Lehelvári, Renáta Csalami, Boglárka Ősz- Püspöki) from the Union's WM's working group visited and served in Gyula church situated on the territory of Tisza Conference.

The goal of our visit was to present the work and tasks of WM's Department and raise the awareness of the EnditNow programme that was initiated by the General Conference.

During the morning service Edit Bihariné Lehelvári presented in a few minutes on the actuality and the importance of the EnditNow initiative. Zsóka Bodnár- leader of WM's department held the sermon written especially for this occasion by the representative of the General Conference.

The local church members were invited to join us during the afternoon service for a discussion with an expert in domestic violence. Our moderator was Renáta Csalami. The expert Kornélia Hrabovszky had an expertise in clinical psychology specializing in interpersonal violence. With her help the questions raised were answered in the most professional way.

We have discussed questions like: How many people are affected by violence in Hungary? What are the symptoms of trauma? What kind of psychological or physical symptoms can be found in case of children when facing abuse?

At first the brothers and sisters hardly opened up, but slowly they gained courage and we had a more than two hour long discussion. The final conclusion of the local church members was that we should talk more often about this issue, and even young people should talk about it regularly. We prepared some tangible gifts for those present. The psychologist brought books that can help those who are interested in this topic. The WM's working group handed out leaflets, which contained all the contacts of the county's special service like Family Support etc.

In spite of the fact that this topic is not one that you just talk about so easily with anybody, we hope that we could help the local community in some way and at least we have shown possibilities how to help when we meet situations where victims are suffering from any kind of abuse. May God bless all those who have their eyes open to help others!

This was a surprise for both the pastors and wives since they have never taken home gifts for their wives from a ministerial training.



Our goal is that each pastor's wife would be engaged in WM's work on a local level, to taste the joy and blessing this can bring to them.

The pastor's wives were really thankful for the gift they received. At the end of the training each pastor received a bottle of water with the following inscription: "Are you thirsty for the living water?" They were surprised by this gift.

WOMEN'S CIRCLE IN NAGYKANIZSA, HUNGARY, 2017

We started our social meetings a year ago, which was due to the idea of one of our members who retired. As she told us later on, her intention was a little selfish, since she wanted to reduce the time spent alone. However, this initiative has become quite beneficial and influential to all of us.

Though it is not very easy to get together from time to time; we sometimes need to struggle to make it happen. There are times when there are only 4 of us and sometimes there are 12. Nevertheless, each time we are thankful to God for the blessings we experience right away and afterwards, as well.

First, we started with listening to each other to the testimonies how the Lord had found us. In other words, how we became converted. It was fantastic to learn the different miracles that happened to each of us. Thus, we got to know each other even better. Then we studied the Bible through the Woman's Bible version. We explored different topics like: Being a Christian Mother in a Changing World, Making a Difference in Today's Society, Virtues in the Bible, Some Interesting Facts, or the Outlook. Then we had two sections for prayer: one for the person, who gave her testimony, so that Jesus may continue His work in her life, helping in her struggles; the other part was for the church as a whole. For unity in the first place, showing respect and Christian love to one another and we were pleading to God for providing us opportunities to minister as a community, apart from our individual lives. It was a great challenge for us, since our town is strongly Catholic, hardly accepting any other denominations.

God is so good. He answers prayers in so many ways. We are so happy to be able to minister in social work, to hold evangelistic meetings in the library, and we also began to adopt the Life development programme to our community, which works really well. What is more, new little pathfinders are coming to our church. This is a good way to reach families.

We are going on with our women's circle, which is about our present testimonies about experiences with the Lord, challenges, and prayer requests. I find it a very good way to experience fellowship. We haven't stop praying for our church, of course.

The Woman's Bible is something very helpful to explore some specific topics which are relevant, but we haven't thought of it as a discussion topic or a way of discovering the Bible. It seems to me that we are fascinated enough to carry on, but we still need prayers.

I asked the local church members each Sabbath to pray for this ministry and we continued to gather more and more of our sisters to the women's circle. Each time a new lady was assigned with the task to lead the discussion in the given Bible topic.

We were happy to experience that our monthly cheerful gatherings had more and more participants. We got to know each other better and also celebrated birthdays in our group. Some of the men from our church started to be interested so we invited them to attend our meetings once in a while.

With the arrival of the nice weather we decided to organize a trip to Bükkszentkereszt, a locality situated not far from Miskolc. We were really happy that even the youth from our church joined us and some of our previous members whom we lost from our church.

Our next trip was to Vizsoly and we asked the whole church to invite non-Adventist friends to come. Praise be to God that on this trip we had so many non-Adventist friends who attended.

We would like to continue to strengthen our church community with this ministry, because thanks to it we experienced that we got closer to each other as sisters. We are open to each other during the week as well, not just on Sabbaths since we share our sorrows and joys and we feel that our group has increased. Among many other goals in the future we would like to help the older sisters who have one by one individual needs thus giving a good example for our youth and we also want to organize such unique programmes by which we could reach people who are really longing to know God.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY IN NYÍRTURA

In our local church the sisters are engaged in ministry both jointly and personally as well. We try to develop our relationships with those around us personally and whenever we ask for a favour from someone we are giving books as a gift and talk about God's love and mercy.

We also have a joint mission with the ladies. We visit regularly the Child Host Institution in Nyírszőlő- a place situated not far from our church. Our hands are never empty when we go to see them, but filled with homemade cakes and cookies, healthy fruits and clothes they can wear. We always go with a longing eager heart since these children are never visited by their parents. Only foster parents come once in a while to take them out.

We talk to them about God's love, because they have to know that even though their parents left them God never abandons them and they can turn to Him. He gives them comfort and listens to their prayer. Many times they are crying on our shoulders since their mother or father promised to take them home previously, but never came. Every day we pray for them and tried to go and visit them on a weekly basis.

One of the ladies was able to take home two little boys, thus becoming their foster parent, but she is trying to connect with the real parents and is helping the family financially and spiritually as well.

We are always looking for outreach possibilities and are asking God to give us wisdom to be able to praise him in everything we do.
