"FREE FROM FEAR" AUC SEMINAR

On Sunday 7th March 2021 we held a video seminar for women called "Free from Fear". The online seminar was organised by the Women's Ministry Department at the Adriatic Union Conference, attended by over 150 believers, friends and guests from Slovenia, Albania and Croatia.

Our guest speakers were Dragana Kovačević and Ana Đuver. Dragana Kovačević is a lay pastor from Kotor in Montenegro. Her interesting lecture was based on 2 Kings 4: 1-7, where she talked about a wonderful experience and journey through moments when God manifested himself in her life. At the end of her presentation, Dragana asked us two questions. 1. How do you react when you find yourself in hopeless situations? and 2. Do you believe that God will take care of your needs as he'd done before?

Our second speaker Ana Džuver, vice dean at ATVU in Maruševec and head of AUC Department of Education. When we asked her for a few words about herself to be introduced, her response was that she "considers it her greatest honor to be able to work in shaping young minds at ATVU in Maruševec and that she finds her greatest joy in studying and sharing God's word with anyone who wants to hear it." Ana spoke about the text, Luke 13: 10-17. We were so encouraged by her message and moved to think about the following thoughts.

"Do you know of a woman who reminds you of the cramped woman in the bible?

It can be a little girl or a woman who has low self-esteem and low self-confidence, living in fear, anxiety, living to please others and feeling ashamed. Put yourself in her shoes and look at how she may view the world, how she feels, how she reacts to different situations. Try to come up with ways to befriend such a person and help her begin to live in the freedom in which Jesus calls her."

The message was followed by workshops and a break-out room where we were divided into small groups to talk and pray for each other. We were also called to remember the women in our lives who encouraged us and helped bring us closer to Jesus.
